# Urgent: Shelters in Crisis – Animals Need Your Help Now More Than Ever



Right now, animal shelters across the country, including in our area, are facing a crisis like we've never seen before. Many shelters have been forced to temporarily close for intake due to an overwhelming number of pets being surrendered, something that's unheard of in our region. This is a heartbreaking situation, and animals need your support now more than ever. Financial struggles, housing issues, and life changes are forcing many people to give up their beloved pets, leading to overcrowded shelters and overwhelmed staff. This isn't just a distant issue - it's happening right here in our community. And without action, the situation will only worsen.

#### Here's how you can help:

Adopt: Adoption is a lifeline for these animals. Shelters and rescues in the area are filled with loving cats, dogs, rabbits, and more - all waiting for a second chance. When you adopt, you not only and together, we can give these pets the gain a devoted friend but also make room for another pet in desperate need. If you don't see the right match here, please ask us for recommendations - we work closely with other shelters and are happy to refer you to those in need.

Foster: Fostering is a critical way to free up space in shelters and provide comfort to pets who may be scared or anxious in a shelter environment. While we don't have a formal foster program at JSAC, we can connect you with shelters and rescue groups that do. Email us at info@ jerseyshoreanimalcenter.org for referrals.

Donate: Every dollar counts. Donations help cover veterinary expenses, food, supplies, and the essential daily care these animals need. We also welcome material donations - you can check our wish list for ideas. Even the smallest contribution can make a world of difference in the lives of homeless pets.

Educate: Please share the plight of overpopulation, the importance of spaying and neutering and advocate for adopting. We are their voice – and we need to rally together to help these animals. They depend on us. By adopting, fostering, or donating, you can play a vital role in easing this crisis. The bond between humans and animals is transformative, futures they deserve.

Have a plan! Do you have a written plan for your pets should something happen to you or your situation changes? This plan should include detailed instructions that indicate who will be the pet(s) caretaker. Before you choose a caretaker, please give careful consideration to your pets emotional and physical needs. caretaker should be involved in all discussions and should be in agreement with your wishes. Often, we see situations where caretakers are named, they have no idea they were named and they are not in the position to care for your pet. Also, things change, life happens- revisit your plan often to assure that your wishes can be accommodated. For example, if you made the plan many years ago, the caretakers named could very well not be in the position now to help. Many situations that result in pets being surrendered to shelters can be avoided with realistic and proper planning.

Let's stand up for those who can't stand up for themselves. With your help, we can change the fate of countless animals and give them the loving homes they so desperately need. Please, take action today.

#### Veterinarian Corner

#### Happy Holidays for Pets from Dr. Baris:

Happy Holidays! While all animal lovers want our pets to enjoy the holidays with us as members of our families, we should take certain precautions to keep them safe and happy. Many pets enjoy meeting our friends and family, but some become scared or overwhelmed by visitors. Be sure to provide a safe space for your pets so they can retreat if they feel the need for some private time. If they are extremely upset by holiday festivities and visitors, you can always talk to your veterinarian about medications to promote relaxation and relieve anxiety.

We would also love to share our holiday delicacies with our fur babies, but there are some foods which are not safe for pets to eat. This is not a complete list, but here are some foods to avoid:

- 1. High fat foods
- 2. Raw foods, such as eggs, meat, and fish
- 3. Alcohol
- 4. Bones
- 5. Candy, especially chocolate or sweets containing xylitol
- 6. Onion or garlic, both fresh and powdered
- 7. Coffee, including beans and chocolate covered espresso beans
- 8. Grapes and raisins
- 9. Trash

(keep lids secure or put trash in an inaccessible room)

If you are worried that your pet has ingested something toxic, you can bring your pet to a veterinary hospital immediately or you can call the ASPCA Poison Control Center at (888)426-4435.

Remember that holiday plants such as ivy, holly, mistletoe, and poinsettias are also toxic to pets. Pine needles, while they are not toxic, can cause upset stomachs and possibly intestinal obstruction if our pets eat enough of them. Tinsel is another decoration to use with caution. Cats especially love to play with it, but they also like to swallow it. Tinsel can cause vomiting and possibly an intestinal obstruction. Surgery might be needed to remove it.
